Josh Case Study Directions

Please note that this particular case study does include a student with special needs—this is however NOT a special education course nor do I expect you to be knowledgeable in this area. As many of you indicated back in session 1 threads....in order for teachers to have an attitude that is fearless in the use of technology, encourages them to take risks, and inspires them to be life-long learners (NCATE, 2002)—teachers need to be knowledgeable about AT/UD applications (even as related to special needs) so that they can then generalize how many of these applications can also be applicable to the general student population or other specialized populations such as ESOL
